G 4: Offer STC Summer Leadership Institute

Offer STC Summer Leadership Institute for ISD counselors and teachers.

G 5: Offer parent counseling programs

Offer parent counseling programs.

G 6: Provide more support for ADA/special populations

Provide more support for ADA/special populations

O 1: Target FTIC students for priority registration

Target FTIC students for priority registration and educate them to get academic advisement and register early.

Related Measures:

Track the early registration trend via Dashboards and compare the FTIC enrollment number increase for Spring 2009 over Fall 2008.

Achievement Target:

There will be 7% increase in FTIC students doing early registration, compare the FTIC enrollment number for Spring 2009 over Fall 2008.

O 2: Add higher level advising training

Add higher level advising training, using scenes for learning and reflection.

Track the number of faculty members getting advanced level of faculty advising certifications.

O 3: Expand Beacon Mentoring to more gatekeeper courses

Track the increase of the number of Beacon Mentoring classes

Source of Evidence: Academic Direct Measure

Achievement Target:

Increase the Beacon Mentoring classes by 10 classes each semester.

O 4: Offer a comprehensive summer leadership institute

Offer a comprehensive summer leadership institute to educate ISD professional about college student services.

Related Measures:**M 4: Attitudinal survey**

The survey results will show positive attitudinal shift toward the college.

Source of Evidence: Student satisfaction survey at end of the program

Achievement Target:

90% of ISD professionals (interns) will show positive shift of attitude toward the college.

O 5: Conduct workshops and orientation for parents

Conduct workshops and orientation for parents to train parents on providing support for students to promote their college success.

Benchmark the number of parents getting certifications for parent counseling.

Benchmark the number of parents getting parent counseling certifications (possibly 25 parents).

O 6: Offer additional services to ADA/Specialpopulation

Offer additional student support services to address the special needs of our ADA/Special student populations.

Track the percentage increase of ADA/Special student populations completing accommodation evaluations, which lead to accommodation services.
